2 Examination Structure

Duration	45 minutes for each paper (Core: 9:45am-10:30am/ Elective: 11:00am – 11:45am)
Format	Open-book paper-based multiple-choice examination (30 questions for each paper)

ASHK Certificate is made up of two parts - (i) Core paper; (ii) one of the two Elective paper, i.e., Life Insurance and General Insurance. Each paper will take 45 minutes for 30 questions.

As this is an 'open book' examination, candidates are allowed to bring printed reading materials (e.g. their own notes, syllabus, study guides, regulations, professional standards, guidelines and industry standard practice) into the examination room. However, candidates are not allowed to access to these materials via mobile phones or hand-held computers (e.g. iPad). Internet and email access are not allowed at all times during the examination.

- 3 Applicants are recommended to read the Examination Regulations posted on the ASHK website (click "Education & Career" > "Actuarial Education & Certification" > "ASHK Certificate Scholarship") before attempting the Examination. Failure to abide by these rules and regulations will result in the invalidation of examination results and may lead to disciplinary action.
- 4 Examination passers on both papers who are non-ASHK Fellow Members will be awarded the "Certificate in Hong Kong Insurance Markets and Regulations (Life Insurance/General Insurance)".
